The Captain Is Happy.

The drum corps, swinging Japanese lanterns, open house, and refreshments for all were Capt. Joseph Chedester's way of telling the world that he is its happiest man. And the reason is Mrs. Annie Winslow Hayes, 3637 Cornell avenue, who became his wife, June 14.

Captain Chedester is 81; his wife is 73. They met at a Grand Army encampment here five years ago, renewed the acquaintance three years later, and three weeks ago the groom-to-be left his home at Redlands, Cal., to make Mrs. Hayes Mrs. Chedester.

The captain has six children, all married; twenty-three grandchildren and ten great-grandchildren. Mrs. Chedester likewise numbers three younger generations in her family; a son and

daughter, six grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Feels Thirty Years Younger.
